2021 Dickson Awardee: Laurence Brunton

Laurence Brunton is an emeritus professor at the <u>UCSD</u>

<u>School of Medicine</u> and an experienced researcher in cardiovascular physiology and pharmacology (cyclic nucleotide metabolism, subcellular compartmentation of signaling). For 30 years, Laurence Brunton was responsible for the autonomic pharmacology/physiology labs that all MS1 and Biomedsci PhD, reducing animal use and turning the required 3 one-day lab sessions into a ten-week elective



cours with training in ethical use of animal subjects, instrumentation, and simple surgical techniques. Laurence started a mentored postdoctoral training program called IRACDA
(Institutional Research and Academic Career Development Award) which focuses on training minority postdocs and providing academic skills.

Laurence's main academic effort is the editing and writing of *Goodman & Gilman's* The Pharmacological Basis of Therapeutics, a book known as "the blue bible of pharmacology" and "the gold standard in pharmacology" for which he has served as Editor-in-Chief for the past 18 years. Laurence maintains a website that permits students at most schools of medicine and pharmacy nationally to have electronic access to the book free-of-charge, contributing to medical education worldwide. Continuing a tradition started by the late Prof.

Patrick Ledden, Laurence has helped organize and guide campus-wide monthly faculty luncheons for faculty to hear from other faculty members and provide cross-campus and cross-department meetings that get faculty to venture outside their daily academic boundaries.
