
2015 Dickson Awardee: Wayne Cornelius

Wayne A. Cornelius is an He is an emeritus professor in the UCSD School of Medicine's Division of Global Public Health, where he specialized in immigrant health. He is also Distinguished Professor of Political Science Emeritus and the Theodore Gildred Professor of U.S.-Mexican Relations Emeritus, at UCSD. Wayne founded the Center for US-Mexican Studies at UCSD and served as its director.



Since retiring in 2009, Wayne has served as a member of the Leadership Committee of the ninecampus UC Global Health Institute. He also serves as its co-director for Education, which has designed a three-campus MS in Global Health. At UCSD he holds an appointment as a core faculty member of the Division of Global Health in the Department of Medicine and continues to serve as director and founder (without compensation) of the Mexican Migration Field Research and Training Program, which received great praise.

Wayne as also has published six books, six refereed journal articles, eight book chapters, and six other articles – all dealing with his specialty, Mexican immigration. He also published an op-ed in the New York Times and an article on national immigration policy for *Chronicles*

Since retiring, Wayne has also served on committee of the National Research Council/National Academy of Sciences on immigration enforcement and as proposal reviewer for a State Department program on Education Innovation. He is also a regular volunteer for canine therapy at several San Diego hospitals.

Most notably, Wayne is the recipient of the Order of the Aztec Eagle, Mexico's highest award to non-citizens. It was conferred by President Calderon in 2012 in recognition of his achievements over a lifetime of scholarship focused on U.S.-Mexican relations.
